

#### ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Around the world, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing -- Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People -- all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

Received during the season of Lent, each gift to One Great Hour of Sharing helps to improve the lives of people in these challenging situations. The Offering provides us a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need. In fact, One Great Hour of Sharing is the single, largest way that Presbyterians come together every year to work for a better world.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees. Presbyterian Hunger Program takes actions to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. Self - Development of People invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice, and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues.

#### FLOWER MART FESTIVAL - MAY 5 & 6

Flower Mart was founded in 1911 by the Women's Civic League, an organization formed to advocate for better living conditions in the City of Baltimore. A focal point of the original market was to encourage flower, plant, and vegetable gardening in the yards of homes and vacant lots—thereby making them green. The Women's Civic League managed the event for almost ninety years, and along the way the festival's signature Lemon Stick treat was introduced—a porous peppermint stick used as a "straw" to suck the juice out of a halved lemon—sweet and tangy—and very refreshing.

The women of First Presbyterian would likely have been involved in the planning of this event as we had many ministries to parents and children or to factory workers and immigrants who lived in crowded conditions.

The festival will be held Friday May 5th and Saturday May 6th in the parks surrounding the Washington Monument with booths selling food, plants, seeds, crafts, books, and representing organizations committed to beautification and ecology of Baltimore. The church is not involved in an official way, but would it not be a nice place to spend and hour or two that weekend spreading a smile and meeting some new people. If you want to visit and identify yourself as a member of the church, check with an usher some Sunday and we can get you a name tag.

#### FOOD PANTRY UPDATES

#### March Distribution Totals: 94 Grocery Bags and 94 Produce Bags

We are entering our third year of the First & Franklin Food Pantry. I must confess, I grow weary - weary that the need is as great as ever. It is the kindness of our clients that strengthens my soul and reserve. One of our regular clients recently shared with me, "Thank you and all the volunteers here for all you do to help and encourage me and so many others. Your food bank ministry does great work. I personally could not have moved forward in my life without this church's help. Now that my life is on stable ground, I would like to pay it forward with this \$50 donation to First and Franklin Food Pantry."

With the special COVID funding ending in February, we have seen an increase of need for food in our neighborhood. Basics are always needed and appreciated: cereal, peanut butter and jelly, canned meats and fish, soups, spaghetti and sauce, beans and rice, dried milk, toilet paper and paper towels.

Your support of the Food Ministry is a living example of both sharing God's love with those in need and of finding God in those with needs. We need more volunteers. You will find this a wonderful way to act from your faith. Thank-you.


