

CHRISTMAS BEATITUDES UPDATING MATTHEW 5: 1-12

Blessed are those who have no "home for the holidays," For they will dwell in the house of the Lord forever. Blessed are those in prison solitary without visitors For Jesus will ask them to come up to the head table. Blessed are those who will drink their way through Christmas For their thirst for the eternal will be quenched. Blessed are those without jobs or funds to buy gifts For they will find the hidden treasure buried in the field. Blessed are the atheists being shelled in foxholes For they will find the peace that passes understanding. Blessed are the children whose parents have died For God will wipe the tears from their eyes and hold them close. Blessed are those stuck in refugee camps For they will find welcome in a promised land without violence. Blessed are those who have outlived all their companions For they will sense around them the great cloud of witnesses. Blessed are the prophets who cannot forget the suffering For they will see the Lamb who was slain lifted up in the power of love. Blessed are those who never think of children For they may see God's face in the smile of a baby nestled on the pavement.

This Christmastime, some of us will have seen God's hand in the votes of millions for truth and justice, to preserve democracy, and we may root for the valiant Ukrainians to preserve their country. Still, we know that many wars are being lost, many are losing their livelihoods and homes and rights, in the Holy Land and other holy lands. The Education Committee recommends the book, *Holy Disruption*, which urges hope in a bigger future than a world of dead ends. Unusually, it uses the Gospel of Mark in Advent, as Mark has no birth narrative, nor the cosmic beginning of the Word with God as in the Gospel of John.

My updated beatitudes speak to those who long for good disruption, a gospel reversal of their circumstances. To me, for our church, we need more good construction. But in our worlds, as we clink holiday glasses with friends, may we pray for the scrooges of high finance that God may bless them with consciences that can be awakened. And for us, in whatever gift-buying we do, may it be with discernment about what the other needs to receive, and what we need to give.

Adult Education



On Sunday, November 27th, Adult Education began our Advent series, which we hope will bring us together as a congregation as we move through the season. We will be doing a church-wide study of the book *Holy Disruption* by Tracy S. Daub. This book, along with the Gospel of Mark, will be guiding the music and liturgy at Sunday Worship for a deeper

level of understanding.

What if you can't come to Adult Education on Sunday mornings? No problem! You can read along at home and follow the suggested scripture readings listed to the left.

Need the book? We've got you covered! Copies can be purchased at the church office. A \$10 donation is appreciated, but not required.



ABOUT THE BOOK:

Where's the baby? The Gospel of Mark doesn't have a nativity story. So where's the Advent message? It's in every aspect of Jesus' life, to his death and beyond. The Incarnation (God coming to earth in human form to be baptized, teach, heal, eat, and die) is what we celebrate at Christmas, and Mark shows us just how radical and celebration-worthy it is! *Holy Disruption* presents a fresh understanding of the holiness of Christmas grounded, not in a conventional cozy Christmas message, but through Mark's disquieting gospel which invites its readers to experience God's disruptive but transformative love for us and our world. Multi-Age Sunday School

Our Multi-Age Class has been doing and learning about lessons found in the Book of Exodus with our fourth grade students. Our kindergarten student is learning about the many miracles Jesus performed and how loving his Spirit was when he walked the earth. Additionally, the senior students are learning some ancient geography as they followed Moses and his tribe as they fled Pharaoh. We have made a 'No Whining Weekly Calendar' that signals gratitude, made friendship bracelets and the older students memorized the Lord's Prayer.

Our youngest learner is lovely and as enthusiastic as her classmates. Like the others, she is painting and making all kinds of biblically oriented figures with Model Magic. Art is a big part of our study. Soon we'll begin preparation for a short Christmas presentation. We're hoping to make it a multigenerational short play, so I'm calling for volunteers to join us on December 18, front and center. After Christmas the older students will begin with Jesus' birth through Easter and the youngest student will study the Book of Genesis.

The Multi-Age Sunday School class is led by First & Franklin's Director of Christian Arts & Education Deborah McCrimmon, and takes place on Sundays at 9:00am on the second floor of Backus House.

F&F DECEMBER HISTORICAL TIMELINE

DATE	HISTORICAL EVENT
12/05/1763	First Church Dedicated - Log cabin at Fayette and Gay Street.
12/20/1776	Patrick Allison named chaplain to Continental Congress.
12/01/1811	National Organ Day - First organ obtained over strong objections from James McCulloh. Current organ acquired in 1961.
12/18/1881	Patrick Allison House Complete - Built as a manse for the church. Total cost \$16,000. Designed by Baltimore architect Charles L. Carson who designed other notable religious buildings in Baltimore as well as the first Enoch Pratt Free Library in 1881.


