A WORD FROM REV. MARK PHILLIPS



Greetings, new friends at First and Franklin! Larry and I cannot begin to thank you for the warm welcome so many of you shared with us last month. The weekend far exceeded any expectations that I had. I will never forget the worship service that we shared together on January 14 ... the music, the spirit that was present and tangible ... the vote of the congregation to call me as your new pastor ... and again, the spirit that I felt as I re-entered the sanctuary after the vote. Just as the search for a new pastor has been a journey for the members of the Pastor Nominating Committee and for you the congregation, it has been a journey for me as well. I am looking forward to beginning my ministry with you in mid-April. I covet your prayers as I bring my ministry here in Dearborn to a close, as we look for a new home in Baltimore, and as we sell our home

here. To be totally honest, I can't wait to be with you again on Sunday, April 21.

Speaking of journeys, we begin our Lenten journey this month on Ash Wednesday, February 14. Lent isn't the most exciting idea the church ever had. It's forty days of introspection, prayer, and sacrifice. That doesn't really sound like a good time. At least Advent was upbeat, and it culminated with all of the joy of Christmas. Lent culminates with a ride into Jerusalem where Jesus gets beaten – almost to death – and then hung on a cross to finish the job. It's no wonder that the marketing departments of every retailer in the world have decided to leave Lent alone. Unlike Christmas, this is a hard sell.

It is striking that the early church observed Lent centuries before it came up with Christmas. The season of Lent is forty days, not counting Sundays. As Christ spent forty days in the wilderness preparing for his ministry, Lent offers us a period of sustained spiritual renewal that we may be ready to follow our Lord into the passion of cross in order to encounter the joy of the resurrection. Apparently the custom originated in the Early Church as a period of study, prayer and fasting by candidates for adult baptism. At the conclusion of these forty days, the sacrament of baptism would be administered on the Saturday night before Easter. When the member of the church saw the changes in the lives of those participating in the Lenten program, they eventually decided that they all could use some renewal in their spirituality. No one can really understand the amazing delight of Easter (the first celebration of the church) without taking Lent, or something like it, very seriously. To be risen to a new life with Christ is to experience something so totally different that you have to prepare yourself to really understand it. So as unexciting as Lent sounds, it's really all about opening our eyes to the most exciting message the church has to offer. We are called to new life. Lent is only a way of pushing aside the distractions that prevent us from seeing this delight.

A blessed Lenten journey to all of you.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14. We will hold a candlelight service in the Sanctuary at 6 pm that day. There will be quiet music, reflections from church elders, and the opportunity to receive ashes as a sign of our mortality and of our faith.

The timing of Lent this year coincides with a particular time of transition for our church. Bridge Pastor Steve Nofel is already committed full-time to serving another congregation, and Pastor-Elect Mark Phillips will not join us until after Easter. For this reason, we are not holding our usual Wednesday evening services this year. Instead, we hope all members and friends will set aside some time each Wednesday for Lenten meditations which Steve and Mark have written for us. These beautiful, short contemplative readings will allow us to ponder and pray together as a church family, even when we're not together in person. The first will be distributed on Ash Wednesday, so that some of us will be able both to read it at home and to attend the service at 6 pm.

Please check your inbox every Wednesday for the pastoral meditations, and blessed be the tie that binds us.
