

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

On Sunday, January 14, 2024, directly following the worship, there will be a special meeting of the Congregation of First & Franklin Presbyterian Church to examine and vote whether to call the candidate recommended by the Pastor Nominating Committee as installed pastor of the church. In accordance with the constitution, The Book of Order, of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. the congregation will also be voting on the pastor's compensation package.

For purposes of congregational meetings, only those who are officially "active members" and present at the meeting in-person or electronically may vote. All friends and those who are part of the family, but not members will be able to ask questions and be part of the whole meeting, but not actually vote. EGENTON~ROBERTS FOUNDATION UPDATE



The Board of Managers for the Egenton-Roberts Foundation will be sharing news and information each month on one of the organizations for which we provide grant support. The Board is comprised of First & Franklin Presbyterian Church members and active friends. The grants support programs for girls exclusively.

Middle Grades Partnership is an organization that the Egenton-Roberts Foundation has supported for many years. Each summer, private schools and public schools in Baltimore City are partnered to offer middle school girls the opportunity to participate in a 5-week, full day program that provides a wide range of activities designed to enrich academics and build on interests in the arts, leadership, community outreach, communication skills, and more! The partnership we support is between Lillie May Carroll Jackson Public Charter School and Roland Park Country School and is based at Roland Park.

This summer, board members visited and got to see an English class where work for the summer was centered around a novel, a science class where students were working to construct bridges that could withstand different weights, and a financial literacy class where students were learning to manage budgets and spending—and these activities were just a small part of the day's programming.

Once the summer program is over, students in both schools remain connected by programming throughout the school year that encourages continued relationships through projects and gatherings designed to promote shared experiences.

NATIONAL PARK SERVICE FUNDS FIRST & FRANKLIN HISTORIC RESEARCH

The Baltimore National Heritage Area has awarded First & Franklin a grant funded by the National Park Service to explore its history at the forefront of the LGBTQ+ rights movement in the mid to late 20th century.

The grant will fund the work of a professional historian who will research newspapers and periodicals as well as relevant church records. The grant will also fund a consultant who will create and submit an updated National Register of Historic Places listing. At the conclusion of the project, the National Register of Historic Places listing would elevate First & Franklin's LGBTQ+ history and nationally recognize First & Franklin as a leader in civil rights and social justice.
