#### TRAVEL TO CUBA

Two opportunities are opening up for us to travel to Cuba and visit our sister church in Taguasco. The first visit will be an Encuentro which is being planned for either the end of November or the first week of December. An Encuentro is a Presbytery-to-Presbytery Gathering which is held every other year. Each church in the Baltimore Presbytery may send 2-3 people to this event. During the first part of the week, you will spend several days visiting our family in Taguasco. In the last few days of the week, a general meeting will be held with all the churches of El Centro Presbytery and the Baltimore Presbytery. Time is spent in study, worship, discussions, and fun events together. This type of trip is an excellent way to get a feel of the bonds between the two Presbyteries and visit our partner church. The second opportunity will be a church-tochurch visit in February of 2024. We can set our dates directly with Taguasco and spend approximately 5 days visiting with them. You will be able to meet many members of the congregation, be a part of their ministries, and share love and concerns about our congregations.



For both visits, you will need a current passport and the cost will be around \$1500. We need to leave 4 months in advance to process our visas, so now is the time to plan our visit. Personally, our relationship with Taguasco has been life changing, brought joy, and deepened my faith. I hope others involved with First and Franklin will also be a part of this relationship. #### PER CAPITA PARTICIPATION

First & Franklin is preparing to submit our annual Per Capita fee to the Presbytery of Baltimore and it is based on our membership rolls. Currently, we have less than 50% of our membership participating. This fee is split between the Presbytery, the Synod, and the General Assembly, allowing them to provide valuable resources and support for our various church needs. For instance, the Presbytery provides our Pastor Nominating Committee with information and administrative assistance that helps immensely with the Pastor search process. This year First & Franklin will pay \$40 Per Capita fee on behalf of each church member. For this reason, we encourage those who are able to make a designated Per Capita contribution of \$40 per person to help cover the cost of this annual fee. #### FOOD PANTRY UPDATES

For the month of May, the Food Pantry at First & Franklin distributed food and produce to 107 residents in the Mt. Vernon neighborhood. That makes a total of 214 bags which consists of 107 Groceries and 107 Produce. June of this year is the start of our 3rd anniversary of this Ministry, which started at Reid Chapel under the supervision of former member Sabrina Schumann. It is now under the supervision of Corena Bridges. The Food Pantry has been temporarily relocated to Backus House through the end of June. Additionally, there will be no Food Pantry on the last Saturday of each month, to give our volunteers a much needed break.



#### SUNDAY SCHOOL UPDATE

In this month's Multiage Class message, I am reporting that the two classes are doing extremely well. The fourth grade students will graduate to middle school Biblical instruction next year because they are both academically and religiously ready! I am happy to report that Sophia Smith has moved from a non-reader to a fine reader this year, so she will move from the prekindergarten program to the K-1 program in September.
